<u>Use of Class Dojo –</u>

We're thrilled to announce that after a successful trial with Year 1 and Year 2 last academic year, we have decided to expand the use of the Class Dojo reward system across our school. Class Dojo is a widely recognised behaviour strategy that promotes

positive behaviour in the classroom.

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Each child has their own digital character displayed on the screen in their classroom. Staff can award behaviour points when children exhibit positive traits such as: good manners, kindness, helpfulness, tidying up, and perseverance.

Each class will work towards a collective target of points. If they reach or exceed this target, the whole class will earn an exciting end-of-term treat. We believe this system will not only encourage positive behaviour but also foster a sense of teamwork and community within each classroom.

Behaviour Ethos -

To promote consistently positive behaviour, we are excited to announce the introduction of new school characters, alongside the rollout of 'Class Dojo' across our school.

These characters will help reinforce the values of being Ready, Safe, and Respectful. Posters featuring these characters, along with examples of how children can demonstrate these behaviours in lessons and around the school, will be displayed in every classroom and throughout the school premises.





Birthdays:

Starting this week and to celebrate children's birthdays, children will be able to wear non school uniform on the <u>FRIDAY</u> week of their birthday.
